Our local “Two Town Tuners” are having their annual Barbershop Variety Show on Saturday and this is a favorite annual event in this area.



Along with the Two Town Tuners, a female Sweet Andeline quartet called “SongBurst” will be performing, as well as another Barbershop group called “Flipside.” This show is the group’s biggest fundraiser of the year. They use funds raised for scholarships, summer camps and for costs of the show.
